

DR EMILY MCEWAN-FUJITA

The annual Ned Maddrell Memorial Lecture will be given by Dr Emily McEwan-Fujita at St John's Mill on the 7th October where she will discuss the current status of Scottish Gaelic in Nova Scotia. Presently a Research Fellow in the Department of Anthropology at St Mary's University, Halifax, Nova Scotia, Canada, Dr McEwan-Fujita is a linguistic anthropologist, specialising in the study of Scottish Gaelic language shift and revitalisation efforts in Scotland. Having received a Ph. D and M.A. in Anthropology from the University of Chicago and a B.A. in Anthropology from the University of Illinois, Dr Fujita has conducted ethnographic field research in the Western Isles, Inverness, Edinburgh and Glasgow, but also has a personal interest in Japanese language and culture.

Macmaster/Hay are taking the harp into uncharted territory. Add to this Mary's beautifully pure vocal and Donald's cool grooves, atmospheric percussion and sampled sounds and the result is a truly fresh, dynamic take on Scotland's music.

In their life as a duo Macmaster/Hay have produced two CDs: Love and Reason and the recently released Hook; recorded a live session for the BBC's Late Junction; performed at The Celtic Connections Festival in Glasgow, The Edinburgh Festival Fringe, The Edinburgh International Harp Festival, Lorient Festival Interceltique and The 3rd Australian Harp Festival in Canberra. In late 2009 they both collaborated with Sting on his CD *If on a Winter's Night* with Mary performing with him on "Later with Jools Holland" and appearing on the 'Live at Durham Cathedral' DVD.
